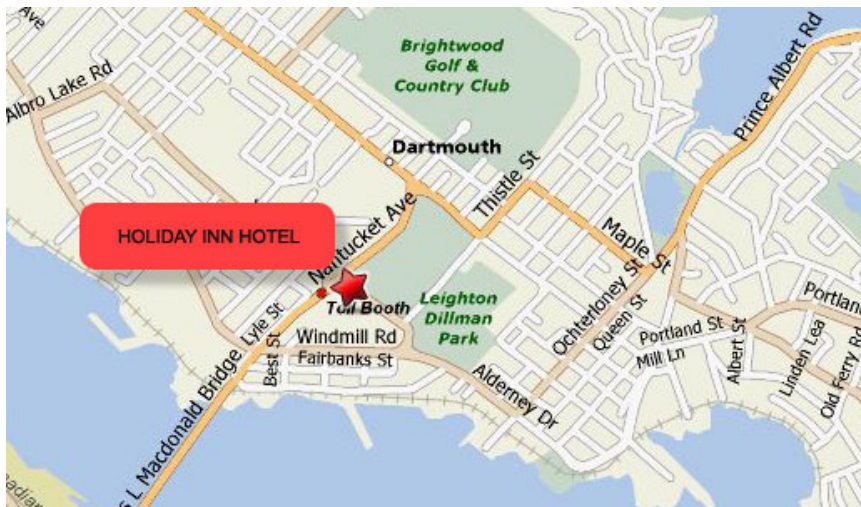


Goal
